WEXFORD, MARCH 18 — On Thursday the Hon. Judge Fox, and the Hon. Judge Mayne, Judges of Assize for the Leinster Circuit, arrived in town from Wicklow, and on Friday opened their respective Commissions. The Hon. Judge Fox sat in the Record Court—Judge Mayne tried the Criminal Business.

Same day, the following trials took place:—

Catherine Power, Mary Barry, John Walsh, Pat. Holden, Denis Doyle, and Pat. Bryan, for felony—acquitted.

John Walsh, found guilty of a felony—Sentence not known.

Geo. Sparks, Nich. Sparks, and Jos. Sparks, for taking forcible possession—Acquitted.

SATURDAY — The whole of this day was occupied in the trial of Archibald Wood, and Isaac Wood, for an attempt to rob the Bank of John Redmond, Esq. on the night of the 3d Jan. last—Acquitted.

At the Assizes of Wicklow, Wm. Shannon was capitally convicted for the murder of John Grace, and ordered for execution on Wednesday last, but being strongly recommended by the Grand Jury, he was respited for a week.

John Casey, alias Magnire, for stealing two hanks of linen yarn, the property of Francis Callaghan, at Glasslough, on the 17th of August.—Gilty; to be transported for seven years.

Patrick M-Cunn, for a rape on Susie Tignor, at Kildough, on the 16th Feb.—Acquitted, prosecutrix not attending.
